CFEI Masking Policy: Despite recent changes in the CDC guidelines for the public setting, those changes do not apply to the healthcare setting. Our mandatory masking policy remains unchanged. Due to an increased risk of exposure in healthcare facilities, and uncertainty regarding the COVID variants, we are keeping our policy the same to ensure the highest level of safety for our patients and staff. Masks must be worn correctly and for the entire duration of your time in our facility. Thank you for your cooperation.
